Edwin Lutyens is known as one of the most remarkable English country house architects and a key exponent of the Arts and Crafts movement. The chance to own a home in a Lutyens house is a rare one. Great Maytham Hall and its Grade II listing reflects its significance as one of the finest and most mature examples of his work.

Apartments are located in the main house and in a range of period buildings including a restored Clock Tower at the start of the driveway that leads up to the house. Each apartment has been created to make the most of the original architectural features and the views over the Rother Valley. Owners of apartments also have the use of a guest suite with en-suite facilities.

Great Maytham Hall lies in the heart of the beautiful Kent countryside just outside the village of Rolvenden. Local shops and pubs are nearby in the village and the market town of Tenterden is about four miles away.

Beautiful Gardens.....

Frances Hodgson Burnett wrote 'The Secret Garden' whilst living at the Hall and the mellow brick walls and wrought iron gate of the old walled rose garden can still be seen today.

The formally designed gardens and 17 acres of grounds overlook the Rother Valley with daffodils and bluebells in the spring and mature flower gardens in the summer and autumn providing colour and interest throughout the year.

Three bedroom cottage at Stonegate in Wye, Kent, sold for £437,500

Stonegate is an attractive development of cottages and apartments by Environ Homes. The properties are set around a well maintained garden square close to shops in the centre of Wye. Some of the properties have single garages. There is a scheme manager and emergency alarm system in all properties.

The historic and attractive village of Wye is set in the beautiful Stour Valley beneath the distinctive chalk crown cut into the North Downs. To the south east of Wye is the village of Brook, adjoining the Chalkland National Nature Reserve.

Wye has excellent communications with its own railway station and easy road access via the M20. Ashford is about five miles away and has Eurostar services to Paris taking about two hours.

The chalk crown cut into the Downs was to commemorate the coronation of Edward VII. It dates from Roman times and owes its original growth to its location at the first ford of the River Stour for travellers on the old British highway now known as the Pilgrim's Way.

The 13th century saw Wye at the height of its fame as a Royal Manor. To the north of the village is the beautiful Godmersham Park, a regular haunt of Jane Austen, and Loantigh House, the birthplace of Cardinal John Kempe. Nearby is the famous medieval village of Chilham with its castle.
